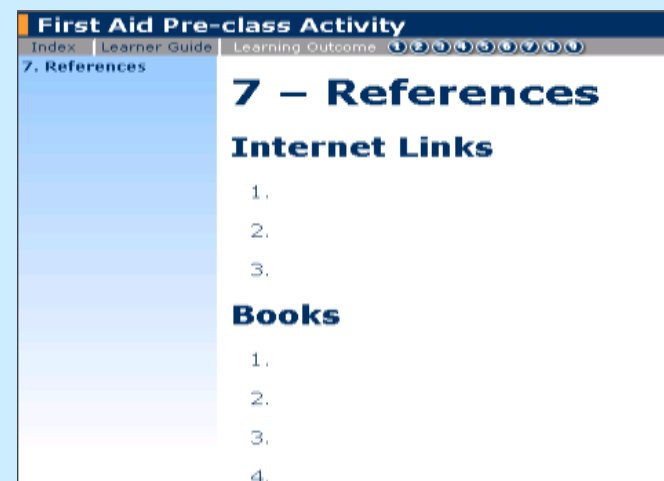

# Support for teachers continued...

- Induction and support of students using online resources via *StudentWorld*
- Effective research techniques training for students

# Ongoing relationships

- Assist with the development and updating of online resources
- Create web-based activities for online modules  
eg Webquests, quizzes
- Provide feedback on students' use of online modules

# Ongoing relationships continued...

- Creation of thesauri to support searching StaffWeb and StudentWeb
- Involvement in the shaping of new version of StudentWeb
- Increased control of the structuring and layout of the Centre's online content
